FRIDAY

F4 Supporting Business, Workers and the Self-Employed during the COVID-19 Pandemic:

Liberal Reform has consistently supported providing extra help to those who have been excluded from government assistance and urges members to support this motion together with the two amendments. Liberal Reform members Oliver Jones -Lyons & Fraser Coppin (Co-Chair) have submitted Amendment One, which proposes to Freeze Corporation Tax at 19% in order to support our SMEs and promote public and private investment. Now is not the right time for tax rises and austerity measures that will only stifle our recovery. Please vote for the amendment.

F6 Lifting Barriers to Work for Disabled People

Liberal Reform supports this motion and makes particular note of our commitment to flexible working as a day one right. Freeing people from the 9-5 working day to something that better suits their needs is an ambition any liberal should champion.

SATURDAY

F11 Giving Consumers a Fairer Deal

Achieving greater benefit for consumers, especially through

increased choice and competition, is a key aspect of Liberal Reform's policy vision. It is therefore disappointing that this motion is rather weak; but we at least welcome that there are no overt calls to follow the Labour Party down the doomed road to nationalisation.

F13 Standing Up for Unpaid Carers

Ed Davey has done well to champion the cause for our unsung heroes and has dedicated a lot of campaign time to this, and we look forward to seeing how it fits into an overall election-winning narrative.

F14 The COVID-19 Pandemic

Restricting people's freedoms with lockdowns is something no liberal should feel comfortable with, but we recognise that although uncomfortable, it has at times over the past year been necessary. We welcome the objection to vaccine passports in this motion, which risk a severe limit on people's freedom for no fault other than being too young to have been offered a vaccine.

F17 The EU-UK Trade and Cooperation Agreement and the Future of the UK-EU Relationship

This motion is right to highlight the damage to free trade and foreign investment that the Government's Brexit deal has done. It is also right to re-iterate that the path to rejoining the EU is a long one that the Party should not seek to rush. Rejoining the single market in particular would be a positive first step.

F18 Acting on the Russia Report

An overall worthy motion but, 5 years on, the Party must not be seen to be continually looking back on the 2016 EU Referendum result.

SUNDAY

F21A A Pay Rise for NHS Staff

NHS staff have contributed so much to our country over the past year, and in truth they have been

poorly supported by the Conservatives for long before that. They deserve a pay increase.

F21B Full Reopening of Schools

Ensuring children's education is not further damaged by the pandemic must be a top priority, and this motion makes it so.

F21C Protecting the Right to Protest

A very worthy motion, only highlighted by the events of the past week; we urge everyone to wholeheartedly support.

F22 Autism Support

Liberal Reform supports this motion, the key to providing people with appropriate support is lifting barriers and making a diagnosis in the first place.

F23 International Development

The commitment to spending 0.7% of GNI on overseas development was a key Coalition victory and it is only right that the Lib Dems continue to champion it.

F25 A Better Response to the Impact of COVID-19 on Education

Liberal Reform think there is a lot of sensible material in this motion. While we think it is good for National Citizen Service money to move to local authorities, we are puzzled as to why this is just for 2020 & 2021 - we don't see why this shouldn't be made permanent.

F26 Accessibility in Education

A good education system is at the heart of a liberal society. It is vital that everyone has equal access to it.

F27 Safe and Legal Routes to Save Lives

The Conservatives' lack of compassion shown towards those fleeing persecution is galling, and the Party is right to call it out in the strongest of terms.
